Theft

Taking someone else's property for the purpose of appropriation. The concept of seizure is understood as the physical removal of the property from the owner's control. This also applies to an object left by him in a place known to him with the intention of taking it later. The requirement of seizure means that it is not possible to steal an item found by the perpetrator or entrusted to him. This does not preclude liability for another crime, namely misappropriation. The object of the theft offence may only be an item of financial value. It should also be someone else's for the perpetrator (i.e. have an owner who is someone other than the perpetrator). Theft can only consist of active action.
